- September 4: Mentoring Begins



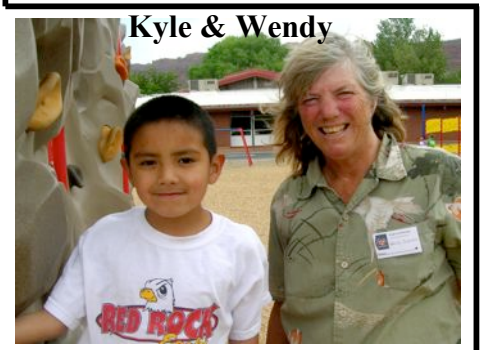
